Alkaline Batteries - \$1.00 per lb. (No fee for rechargeable batteries)

Room A/C Units, Dehumidifiers, Room A/C units, Dorm-Size Refrigerators - \$5.00 each

“The Wall That Heals” Passing Thru Two Rivers Sept. 10; at County Expo Center Sept. 12 to 15

The Wall that Heals, a three-quarters scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C., is being brought to our area in September, thanks to Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 731 of Manitowoc County.

Trucks carrying the wall and related displays will be accompanied by a motorcycle escort, starting from the National Guard Armory on Sandy Bay Road and proceeding west on 22nd Street, south on Washington Street, on to Memorial Drive and to the Expo Center.

That procession starts at 4:00 PM on Tuesday, September 10, from the Two Rivers Armory.

Let's have Washington Street in downtown TR lined with people holding and waving American flags, to honor the arrival of the Wall to our area. Small American flags are available for 50 cents each, in advance of the event, at Unique Flying Objects, 2022 Washington Street. Proceeds benefit the Wall and Two Rivers American Legion Post 165.
