



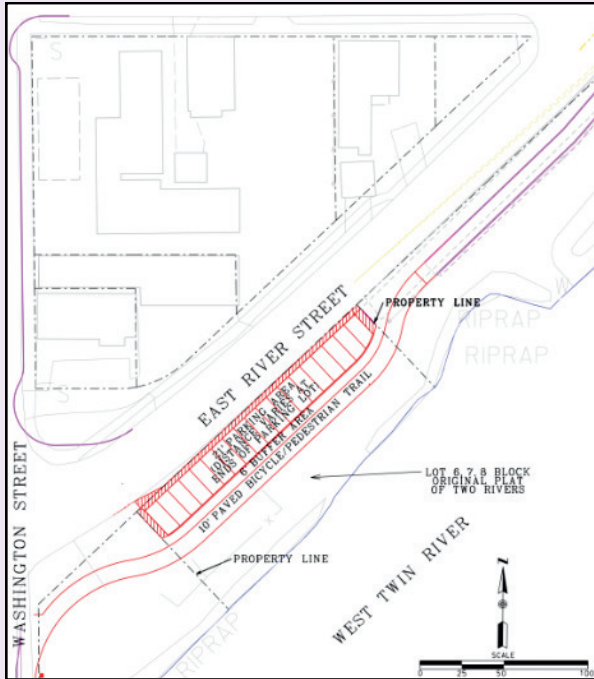

2026 PROJECT SPOTLIGHT



Kozlowski Parking Lot Bike Trail Connection

At first glance, this project may seem like a simple trail extension. In reality, it's about how people safely and easily access one of Two Rivers' greatest assets: our trail system along Lake Michigan.

Right now, getting from the Kozlowski parking lot to the Mariners Trail and nearby routes isn't as clear or as safe as it should be. We need to make it safer. Pedestrians and cyclists often have to navigate around vehicle traffic or find their own path to connect into the system.

This project changes that.

This year, the City will construct a new paved trail segment that creates a direct, clearly defined connection between the parking area and the existing trail network. That means safer access for families, more predictable movement for cyclists, and fewer conflicts between trail users and vehicles.

But this project is about more than just one connection.

It's part of a broader effort to strengthen how everything in Two Rivers ties together. Our downtown, our parks, and our waterfront. Small gaps in trail connectivity can limit how people experience the community. Filling those gaps makes the entire system work better.

This improvement is being completed at a cost of approximately \$22,000, funded as part of the City's 2026 capital borrowing cycle for regular community investment, which this year is just over \$2.2 million. This is the type of targeted, manageable project we plan for each year, making steady improvements without creating large financial spikes.

Annual Water Quality Report 2025

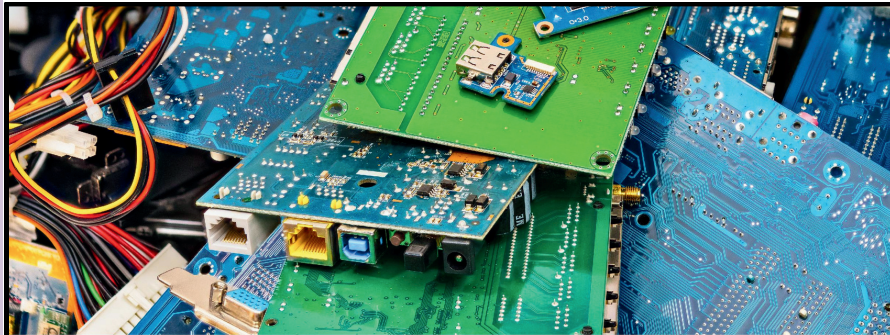
