

9. City Manager's Report B. Status/Update Reports 3. 20th Street Stormwater Pond

Work has commenced on the 20th Street (aka Eggers) Pond located on the East Twin River between 20th and 19th Streets.

Contractor Superior Sewer and Water is currently excavating down to the surface of previously documented contaminated soils, which will be excavated and transported to a disposal site on Mirro Drive. It will be placed there in a manner prescribed in a WDNR permit for managing these soils.








9. City Manager's Report B. Status/Update Reports 3. 20th Street Stormwater Pond

Excess soils are being removed from the site in order to maximize the area available for private redevelopment on the balance of the 3.5 acre site.

The Pond will treat a drainage area of almost 40 acres located between 17th and 22nd Streets on the north and south and from the East Twin River as far west as Adams Street. This will eliminate the need for construction of on-site stormwater management facilities as properties in that area are re-developed.

This ambulance is a 2011 F-450 with an all-aluminum Braun box, recently retired from the Fitch-Rona EMS District in Dane County. It replaces TRFD's oldest ambulance, a 2009 E-series with 230,000 miles.

The purchase of a brand-new replacement ambulance had been budgeted for 2021, but with delays and price increases due to COVID and the chip shortage, purchasing this used unit became an attractive option. The all-aluminum box will be able to be refurbished, painted, and remounted in 2 years on a new Ford F-450 chassis.

WI Dells. The Cadets took 4th Place in the Dispatch Operations event.









11. Concerns About WindBlown Sand Along South
Lakeshore and Memorial Dr.

Near-record high water levels just 2 years ago killed off stabilizing vegetation and washed away protective sand ridges between the highway and the lake.

With water levels now rapidly receding, large areas of sand beach have been exposed, and sand is blowing/drifting onto Memorial Drive, Mariners Trail and adjoining landscaped areas.





The problem is particularly bad from the Roosevelt Ave. intersection to the Lighthouse Inn. City staff has reached out to WisDOT for nearterm measures (snowfence) and is exploring grant funding options for longer-term fixes, such as large-scale dune grass plantings.



WHY? Ice Cream vs. Gelato

- Gelato can be, and often is, made without egg, has more milk and less cream
- Gelato can also be made using water instead of milk, also known as "sorbetto"
- Gelato has 4-9% fat
- Gelato has less air churned into it, making it taste more creamy that ice cream
- Gelato is served at a warmer temperature, so the flavor is intense and not too cold on the tongue
- Traditionally, Italian gelato is served with a spade, not a scoop, and is made with fresh, top quality ingredients to give the gelato the best flavor possible!
