1. Sale of 606 Parkway Boulevard, Former Paragon Property

Sale to Trivers, LLC, an entity controlled by Oshkosh developer Art Dumke, closed on March 17.

Net proceeds to City's Economic Development Fund: \$1,197,031 (\$1.2 million less the title insurance and closing costs).

New owner plans to rehabilitate the facility for lease as manufacturing and warehouse space.

City has applied for WEDC Idle Sites Grant of \$500,000 to assistance the project. Estimated cost for planned work on the facility is over \$6,000,000.





2. Sandy Bay Highlands Home Construction

Plans for two new homes at the Citydeveloped conservation subdivision were approved by the Architectural Review Committee on March 14; one basement is poured, the other is getting poured this week.

At least two other homes are in the planning/cost quoting stages for construction this year.

Since the last Council meeting, total donations committed to the project have increased to just over \$450,000; that's 56.25% of the goal of \$800,000







Final numbers for 2021 Room Tax collections:

December was a very good month, bringing total collections for the calendar year to \$261,161.

That's an increase of \$119,261, or 84 percent over 2021



1. Law Enforcement Grants to Local Agencies Announced by Governor Evers

Governor on March 15 announced grants totaling \$19 million, to police departments across the state. Distribution was reportedly predicated on population and violent crime statistics.

While more details may be forthcoming, Chief Kohlmeier reports that uses can include training, recruitment bonuses, technology investments and meeting community policing needs.

Funding for Two Rivers: \$31,719.02 Other area agencies: City of Manitowoc \$99,487.80, County of Manitowoc \$76,643.55, City of Kiel \$10,812.94.



2. Conclusion of Recent Legislative Session in Madison

### From the League of Muncipalities:

### A. Senate Bill 692, now 2021 Wisconsin Act 175:

Makes various changes to the property assessed clean energy (PACE) program, including expanding the types of projects eligible for PACE financing and changes to the requirements for accessing that financing.

Thank you to <u>Senator Cowles</u> (R-Green Bay) and <u>Representative Thiesfeldt</u> (R-Fond du Lac) for authoring this legislation expanding economic development opportunities in our local municipalities.

B. The League worked hard to halt the fast-tracking of <u>AB 608/SB 840</u>, imposing one-size fits all zoning for workforce housing, and <u>AB 610/SB 630</u>, related to prohibiting certain property tax assessment practices.

C EV Charging Bill Dead. What once was a good piece of legislation which the League supported, ended up with an amendment that excluded local government from participating in the EV infrastructure build out. It started as a bill that would allow the sale of power from EV charging infrastructure without categorizing the seller as a public utility in the state. Unfortunately the end result had all three local government groups (the League, Counties, and Towns) in opposition.

3. Funding for Determination of Federal Interest in Two Rivers

Harbor Study

Senator Tammy Baldwin's office reports that the Omnibus Appropriations Bill that passed the Congress earlier this month includes \$20,000 in funding for the Army Corps to assess the Federal interest in a Design Deficiency Study of the Two Rivers Harbor.

This activity must precede the Corps seeking funding for the study, estimated to cost \$200,000. Such a study could in turn be the basis for Federal investment in structural modifications to the harbor entrance, to mitigate both storm surge and shoaling issues.




4. Confirmation of State Safe Drinking Water Funding for 2022 Lead Service "Private Side" Lateral Replacement

WI's Safe Drinking Water Loan Program has confirmed 2022 funding for Two Rivers of \$207,500.

That will cover principal forgiveness grants for 83 private side laterals at \$2,500 each:

--33 on 17th Street

--50 at scattered locations



The WI Department of Natural Resources has issued a permit to allow grooming of the "new beach" area, south of Neshotah Beach to the north pier.

This permit, good for 5 years, allows the City to "dredge" the area below the ordinary high water mark to remove debris.
