7. Central Park West 365 Project

Answer to question from Council Member Dahlke about cost of water for planned water feature:

Daily water usage on a hot, busy Summer Day estimated at 40,000 gallons. Under the City's current rate structure, that would cost just under \$200.

The water feature will not be in constant operation, but will have an "easy button" that users can press to activate the feature. Will also be able to operate on a timed cycle during evening hours for visual effects.
