
Foundations have been poured for the park pavilion building, and walls will soon start going up. This building is being built by Koenig Construction as subcontractor to Vinton Construction.

Still awaiting word on schedule for installation crew, but hoping that the new playground can be in service by the end of September.





Pursuing Energy Efficiency


Some of the energy-saving projects Two Rivers has completed over the past seven years include:

- Installing a variable frequency drive on a process pump.
- Upgrading to LED lighting and integrating occupancy sensors.
- Incorporating pump controls throughout the plant.

These upgrades provide a more efficient work environment and help the City save more than \$25,000 per year in energy costs. Two Rivers received over \$12,000 in financial incentives from Focus on Energy for completing these projects and will save 228,000 kWh annually. This is the equivalent of reducing greenhouse gas emissions from 34 gasoline-powered vehicles driven for an entire year.


Limited Opportunities for Lead Water Service Lateral Replacement in 2023
