- Expect to start grading and gravelling operations upon completion of underground work

17th St (East Park St to Jefferson St)

- Expect to commence construction in late September
- Road will be closed to through traffic

Scattered Laterals

- Essential Sewer and Water began replacing sewer and water services August 1—contracted for 50 total
- To date, have replaced 30 services throughout the City
- City has posted information on social media regarding funding options
- Expect to complete service installations by the end of October
- City crews continue pavement repairs following service installations.

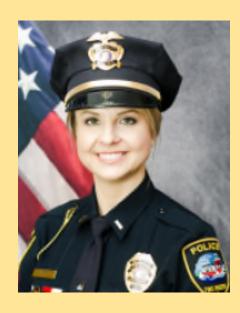


2020 Draft Two Rivers Comprehensive Plan

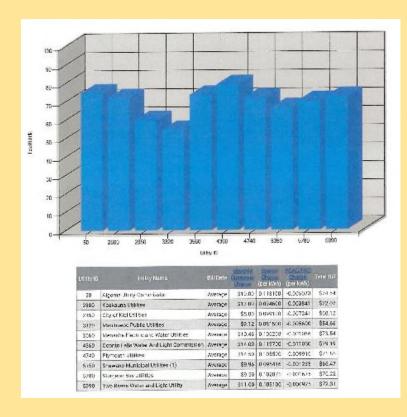
7. Update on Electric Utility PCAC Adjustment and Bill Comparison with Other Utilities

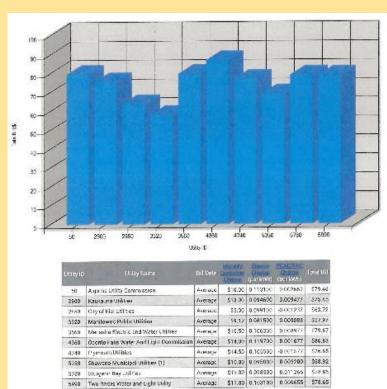
7. Update on Electric Utility PCAC Adjustment and Bill Comparison with Other Utilities

Left: Bills calculated based on 600 kWh per month, January – December 2021

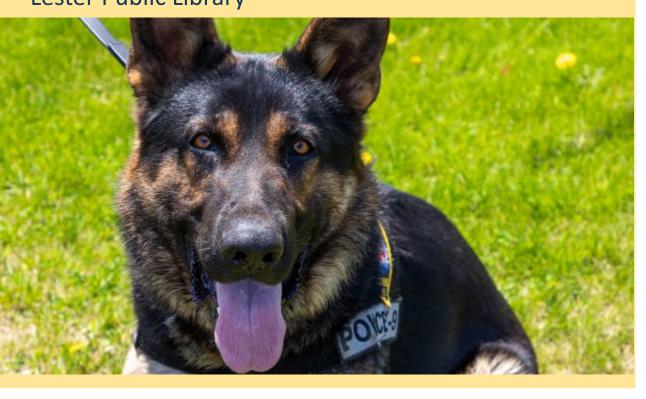
Right: Bills calculated based on 600 kWh per month, January-September, 2022

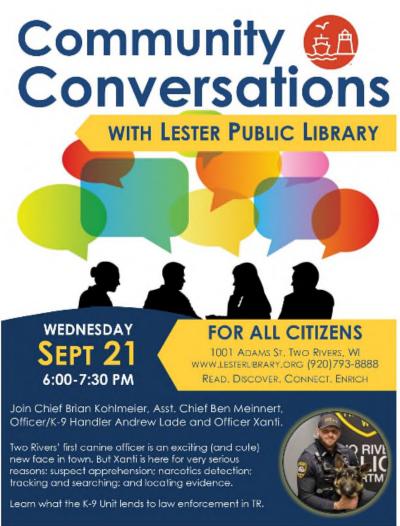
