




Public Works crews have begun work to address uneven surfaces on the tree grates surrounding trees along Washington Street in the downtown business district.

In many locations, part of the solution will involve cutting larger openings in the center of each grate, to allow more room for the tree trunk and nearby root structures.

This will in turn require removal of the upright "tree cages," which are attached just outside that center opening.

Work is proceeding in consultation with Two Rivers Main Street and its Design Committee.







- 1. Wisconsin DNR on February 14, 2024 approved the Two Rivers' Water Utility's request to cease use of sodium hydroxide for corrosion control, following the utility's implementation of orthophosphate feed for corrosion control in September 2023



Because the rate of feed for sodium hydroxide varied, depending on the pH of raw water coming in from the lake, use of that chemical resulted in frequent employee call-ins. Savings from taking that system off-line est. at \$60,000: \$48,000 in overtime and \$12,000 in chemicals.

Orthophosphate cost is \$9,000 per year in chemicals. Feed rate is simply tied to water volume, and will adjust automatically.
