2. Roosevelt Avenue Construction-6th Street to 12th Street Update

Contractor continues installation of water main and is currently working south of 10th Street progressing to south of 9th Street. Water main installation is expected to be completed to this point sometime during the week of 5/7/2024. Contractor then expects to jump back to sanitary sewer installation.

-Contractor plans to install storm sewer in the Roosevelt and 12th Street intersection starting Monday, May 6. Upon completion of the intersection work, Public Works staff will place concrete pavement in this intersection to facilitate vehicular traffic.
