### REMINDER: CITY CODE REQUIRES TURF GRASS ON TERRACES

The City's Code of Ordinances requires that, on curbed streets, the area between the public sidewalk and the back of curb (the "terrace area") be maintained as lawn.

(Where there is no sidewalk, the ordinance requires that the area 4.5 feet back from the curb be treated as a terrace area.)

This area is within the public street right-of-way, and by ordinance the adjoining property owner is responsible for its maintenance.

Specifically, Section 4-1-10, Regulation of Terrace Areas, states "the part of the terrace not covered by a sidewalk shall be maintained as a lawn."

Terrace areas are not to be paved, unless the property owner is granted special permission by the City, in the case of areas "where maintaining a lawn is not feasible."

Just like other lawn areas on your property, grass growing on the terrace is not to exceed eight inches in height. Trees can be planted in terrace areas, either by the City or by a property owner, with a permit from the Parks and Recreation Department's Forester. Removal of trees from the terrace also requires permission from the City Forester.

Mowed lawn is required in the terrace area for good reasons, including controlling runoff into the streets, maintaining visibility for drivers and pedestrians, and accommodating on-street parking.

"Naturalizing" of terrace areas with milkweed, tall perennial plantings and other plant materials is likewise prohibited.

The City has recently received complaints regarding such tall vegetation in terrace areas and will be notifying property owners of such violations. We will require mowing or removal of such plants by the end of the 2023 growing season, so now would be a good time to plan for transplanting any plants you

wish to save.
