Police Department's First K9 Team Up, Running and Out on the Road!

It was just short of a year ago when we received a very generous donation from the estate of James Taddy, former Two Rivers City Council Member. \$50,000 from that donation was earmarked for the start of a new K9 Program for the Two Rivers Police Department. Fundraising for an additional \$50,000 was sought as a "community match" to actually be able to get the program up and running and remain sustainable for the long-term.

Through the generous outpouring of support and donations from our local communities and beyond, we were able to raise the necessary funds in about 6 months. We purchased the equipment and found the Two Rivers Police Department's first K9, "Xanti", a purebred German Shepherd. We selected our first K9 handler, Officer Andy Lade and soon, both went off to their formal training in January of 2022.

At the City Council meeting on Monday, February 21st, Xanti was officially sworn-in as a Two Rivers Police Officer.

Andy and Xanti are now on the road enforcing the laws as a team. We are looking forward to many years of success with our new K9 Team. This is all thanks to those that helped organize the program, provided donations, or provided equipment to the program. Fundraising will continue as we work to ensure our program remains sustainable with minimal impact to the taxpayer.
