





This opportunity reflects the Clerk's ongoing commitment to professional growth and serving our community with excellence.








Bigs with Badges is a one-to-one mentoring program through Big Brothers Big Sisters that connects youth with local police officers in partnership with our public schools.













Two Rivers Water Works previously submitted its Service Line Inventory to the WI DNR as required by the EPA.

During the review process, some of the classifications were not fully aligned with the EPA requirements. The inventory was not approved the the Utility was required to send a Public Notice was sent out to all customers.

Corrections were made and the inventory was re-submitted to WI DNR.

The inventory has now been approved and accepted by WI DNR as compliant with EPA regulations.

Harbor Street, 16th Street and Emmet Street 2025 Reconstruction project

- •Four bids were received and opened on March 20
- •The low responsive bid came from Vinton Construction
- •Construction unit costs are higher compared to the 2024 Roosevelt Avenue reconstruction project, but still **within budget**
- •Engineering Dept. is preparing for an April 21 public hearing on the proposed special assessments, with an informational that afternoon, meeting prior to the hearing
- •Recommendation to award the contract will occur following the assessment public hearing
- Once awarded, will be able to get a proposed construction schedule






