### **KEEPING TWO RIVERS WELCOMING** FOR RESIDENTS AND VISITORS ALIKE



Two Rivers is a welcoming place for visitors—and that includes short-term rentals like those listed on Airbnb or VRBO. In Wisconsin, municipalities are not allowed to ban short-term rentals (STR's) and State law protects property owners' rights to offer their houses as STR's. This is a topic that requires balancing community character with economic opportunity.

To keep things safe and fair for everyone, the City requires STR's to be licensed each year. That means they're inspected, It's obvious how much this community values Neshotah Beach insured, and meet safety standards like working smoke

> Outdoor lighting on STR's must be fully shielded with the light source not visible from off the property or from neighboring outdoor lighting is allowed at STR's and those shall not be

> These rules help ensure our neighborhoods remain great places to live while still giving visitors a chance to experience all that Two Rivers has to offer.

## **NEW POLICE AGREEMENT SUPPORTS**

### **SAFETY IN TWO RIVERS**

On September 15, the City Council approved a new contract with the Two Rivers Police Department union—an agreement that keeps our officers supported and our community protected.

This union contract focuses on what matters most: giving our officers the tools and flexibility they need to serve effectively while keeping City finances on solid ground. Officers will now have more scheduling options for required health and wellness checks, making it easier to stay fit for duty. Financially, the agreement is projected to increase 2026 patrol wages by 3.08%, mainly through step increases for officers that There is no charge for TRUST card rides to and from the Senior keep us competitive with comparable departments.

For residents, this means a police force that is well-supported, fairly compensated, and focused on the job of keeping neighborhoods safe. By investing in the people who protect and serve, Two Rivers is investing in peace of mind for every family, every street, and every corner of our city.

#### E-BIKES & SCOOTERS IN OUR **COMMUNITY: RULES OF THE ROAD**

Electric mobility devices like e-& scooters bikes everywhere! While they are a great way to get around quickly, they can be dangerous. When riding a bicycle, e-bike, scooter, or similar device in the city, operators must follow all state and local traffic laws.



#### **Key rules include:**

- Follow posted signals and speed limits (15 mph max on trails and city property).
- Ride single file and near the right curb, and always signal turns or stops.
- Trick riding, racing, towing, or clinging to vehicles is not allowed.
- Riders must use proper lights and reflectors after dark.
- Parking should be in bike racks or parallel to the curb without blocking sidewalks.
- Riding on sidewalks is prohibited, except for children 12 and under (or an adult accompanying them), police bike patrols, or where specifically permitted by City Council.
- Always yield to pedestrians and give an audible signal when passing.

By following these rules, you can help keep yourself and others safe.



# TRIAD TIPS:

Leaf Pick-Up

All leaves should be deposited into the street gutter and not on the terrace area between the curb and the sidewalk. Leaves on the terrace will not be collected due to the equipment used.

Bagged leaves, branches, sod, and other yard waste will not be collected and should not be mixed in with your leaves. These items must be brought to one of two Manitowoc County compost sites.

The burning of leaves, cardboard, and paper is prohibited, as these materials are recyclable.

The T.R. Senior Center Health and Information Fair is on Thursday, Oct 16, from 8-11 am. This is a free community event open to all.


