

CENTRAL PARK WEST 365 PROJECT

A transformational project to re-invest in Two Rivers' most significant public space, upgrading existing features while adding new features to create a year-round focal point for outdoor activities in the heart of downtown.



1

New Bandstand, Located at the Far North End of the Park

- Includes paved area in front of stage, where a dozen benches can be placed; can also be left clear for use as a patio or dance floor
- Lawn area 50% larger than current lawn area

New Pavilion at the Center of the Park

- Houses public restrooms, plumbing and controls, and a large room for private events, concessions, or skate rentals
- Designed to complement the historic J.E. Hamilton Community House in architectural design and materials. Placed at an angle to Washington St. to minimize impact of view of Community House

Water Feature

- Features ground-level water jets, user activated to conserve water
- Operates on a timed cycle at night, with special lighting effects
- Covered by artificial ice sheets for Winter season

Ice Rink Ribbon

- Features removable sheets of artificial ice, assuring a reliable, extended outdoor skating season
- Ice sheets removed during warm weather months leaving a paved gathering space with northeast portion re-activated as a water feature

5

Seating Wall

- Seating wall along the east (Washington Street) side of the park makes use of a retaining wall that accommodates lowering south end of the park to the same elevation as W. Park Street
- Provides safety barrier to deter children from running into Washington Street from area of the water feature and ice ribbon

Redesigned West Park Street

- Street narrowed for traffic calming, designated one-way northbound, likely incorporating 15 mph posted speed limit and speed tables
- Drop-off area for Community House and Park and 11 diagonal parking spaces in north half of the block without interfering with traffic flow from future development in former Wells Fargo building

Estimated Cost

- \$1,600,000 including contingency

Timetable

- Bid: Summer 2022
- Construction: Fall 2022-Spring 2023
- Dedication: Summer 2023

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Naming and Recognition Opportunities

1

Park Pavilion - \$250,000

Located in center of park, housing restrooms, plumbing and controls, and a large room available for private events, skate rentals, etc.

2

Bandstand - \$100,000

Performance focal point at north end of park.

3

Skating Loop - \$60,000

Synthetic ice skating rink and loop on south end of park.

4

Water Feature - \$60,000

Summer splash pad/water feature area in the center of the park.

5

Pavilion Patio - \$50,000

Park entrance off Washington Street with seating area and rental opportunities.

6

Catenary Lighting - \$30,000

Decorative hanging lighting above the skating loop.
