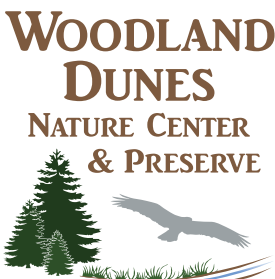
Point Beach State Forest features 3,000 acres of land and 6 miles of sandy beach along the shores of Lake Michigan. Point Beach offers family campsites, two large group cabins and an outdoor group camp.



Mariner's Trail is a beautiful, hard-surfaced recreational 7-mile trail running along Lake Michigan connecting the cities of Manitowoc and Two Rivers, Wisconsin. Many take time to walk, bike, in-line skate, or run while enjoying the cool lake breeze and the beautiful shoreline scenery.



Woodland Dunes Nature Center and Preserve contains over 1,500 acres of hardwood & conifer forests, wetlands, ridges & swales, and prairies located between Two Rivers and Manitowoc Wisconsin. There are 7 miles of hiking trails to enjoy and a kayak launch at the end of Cattail Trail.



The **Van der Brohe Arboretum** offers a community green space for visitors to enjoy recreation, nature and art. The grounds are free to the public from dawn to dusk. Our trails are accessible for all ages. The outer loop is about 1 mile, with trails that connect weaving across the property.



The **Ice Age Trail** is one of eleven National Scenic Trails in the country. Its 1,200-mile path, which highlights glacial features, travels through some of Wisconsin's most beautiful areas. Nearly 16 miles of the Trail is located in/near Two Rivers.

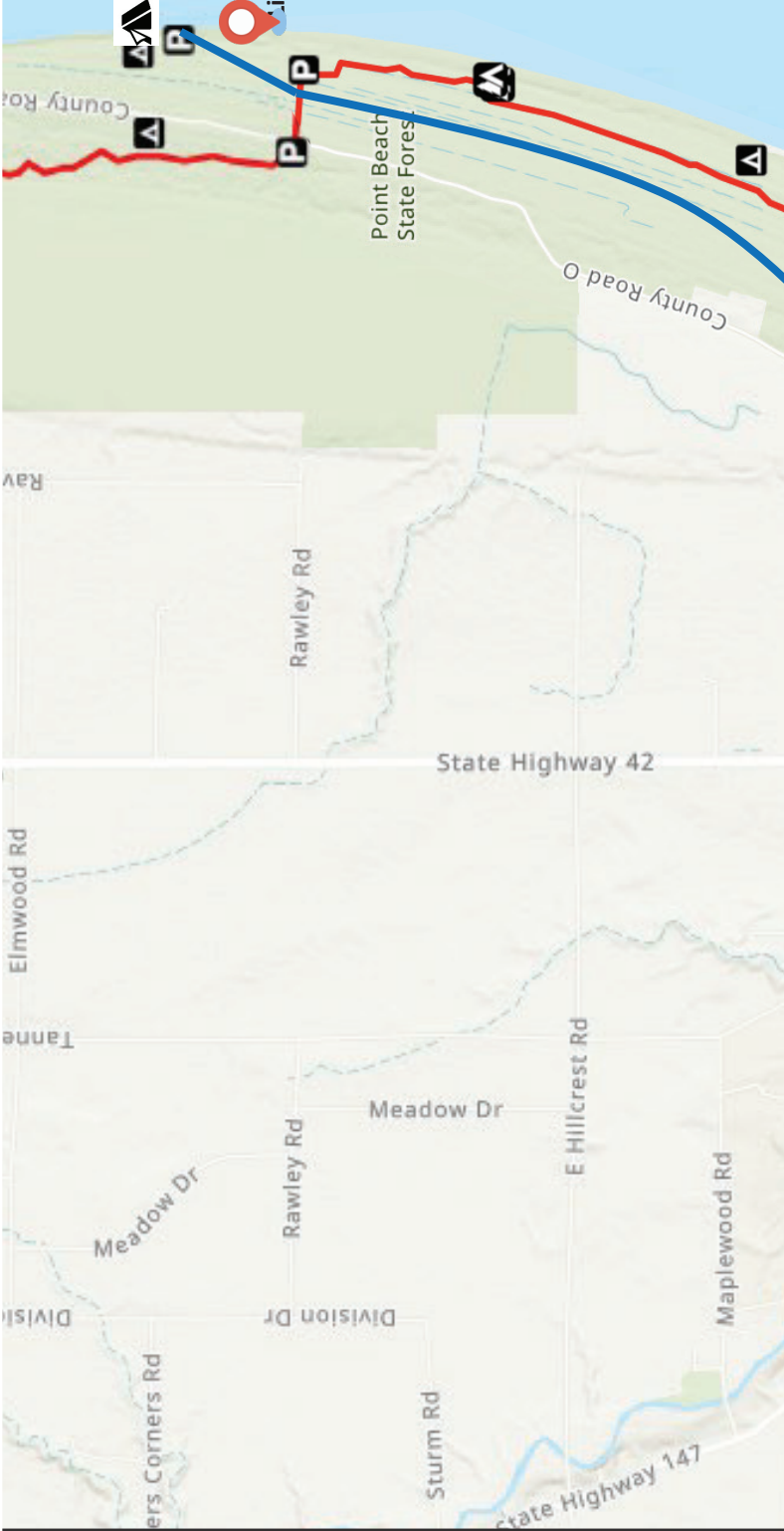

SHIPWRECKS

The 36 historic shipwreck sites within the sanctuary represent vessels that played a central role in building the nation between the 1830s and 1930s. Twenty seven are listed on the National Register of Historic Places and research suggests that another 60 shipwrecks may yet to be discovered.
