

# OTHER RECYCLABLES

## YARD WASTES

- Yard wastes may not be put into the garbage as they have been banned from state landfill sites. Household mulching and composting are recommended.
- Yard waste can be taken to one of the Manitowoc County Composting sites:
  - \* 4191 Woodland Drive, Manitowoc; 1/2 mile south of Highway 310. Open mid-April through mid-November.
  - \* 3000 Basswood Road, Manitowoc (behind the Manitowoc County Recycling Center); off CTH P, 1/4 mile west of CTH R. Open year round.Yard wastes such as grass, leaves, and garden waste are acceptable as is chip-pable brush (6-inches or less in diameter, 5 feet or less in length). Stumps and unchippable wood are not considered yard waste and should be disposed of at the Ridgeview Landfill site in Whitelaw. Separate waste by type and dump it in the designated areas at the composting sites. Plastic bags, boxes, or other containers used to transport yard waste cannot be deposited in the compost area. Dirt, rocks, sod, and ashes are not accepted. Loads may be subject to inspection.

## TIRES, BATTERIES and MAJOR APPLIANCES

- No longer disposable in landfills
- Check with auto service suppliers and area recycling centers

## HAZARDOUS WASTE

- Clean Sweep held annually (based on available grant funding). Examples of acceptable materials include pesticides, solvents, thinners, moth balls, oil and lead based paints, contaminated oil, and antifreeze.

## USED MOTOR OIL

- City of Two Rivers residents may drop off used motor oil at the Public Works Shop, 1415 Lakes Street. The hours are 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Mondays through Fridays. Empty your containers into the collection drum and take your containers with you. Containers may not be deposited at the Public Works Shop. We do not accept use motor oil from commercial businesses.



	Materials Accepted	How Materials Are to Be Prepared	What Materials Are <u>NOT</u> Accepted
	<b>Plastic #1 and #2 Bottles</b> - Bottles only; check for a neck. 	Empty, rinse well, and flatten. No caps. Labels removed, if possible. Remove the caps and rings when possible. Please do not tie milk jugs together or tie in plastic bags.	Any plastic containers without code 1 or 2, or unnumbered containers. No tub, pail or bottled-shaped containers; no plastic bags, wraps, Styrofoam. No motor oil, cooking oil, or pesticide bottles
	<b>Cartons</b> - Food and beverage cartons including shelf stable and refrigerated cartons for wine, milk, juice, cream, soup and egg substitutes.	Cartons should be emptied, flattened and placed in with the plastic bottles.	No cartons that have food products remaining in them.
	<b>Glass Bottles</b> - Any clear, green & brown glass bottle or jar	Clean well. Remove lids and caps. Labels removed if possible.	No window glass, light bulbs, clay, ceramics, drinking glasses, dishes, or ovenware.
	<b>Cans</b> - Tin, steel, bi-metal, and aluminum. Coated cans, foil and pie tins	Empty, rinse well, and flatten. Remove labels if possible.	Full or partially full containers; pots, pans, nails, sheet metal, appliances, or aluminum siding
	<b>Cardboard</b> - Brown corrugated cardboard; brown grocery bags, boxboard	Should be clean and dry, flattened and boxed, bagged or bundled.	Soiled or wet cardboard (no pizza boxes). No cardboard coated with wax, tin, or plastic.
	<b>Paper</b> - newspapers, junk mail, magazines, construction paper, computer paper, books with metal or plastic binding removed etc.	Paper should be clean and dry and placed in a brown paper bag.	No soiled paper, paper coated with tinfoil or glitter, glues colored with crayons or markers, or plastic wrapping paper.
